**RE:** **FENCE MONITORING FOR THE ASCON LANDFILL PROJECT SITE, CITY OF HUNTINGTON BEACH, ORANGE COUNTY, CALIFORNIA**

**PCR Services Corporation (PCR)** biologist Crysta Dickson conducted the weekly fence monitoring for the ASCON landfill project site on August 3, 2010. Ms. Dickson was escorted by Steve Howe of Project Navigator.

The entire project site was driven and all fencing (both construction and chain-linked) was inspected to ensure fencing was intact and no impacts have occurred to the disturbed coastal salt marsh or southern tarplant (*Centromadia parryi* ssp. *australis*) populations and/or individuals which are to be avoided and preserved.

During the inspection, Mr. Howe pointed out fencing that was damaged in two locations due to heavy equipment moving through the area. Ms. Dickson inspected these areas and it was confirmed that no southern tarplant were impacted. Mr. Howe indicated that the fencing was to be fixed that day.
